The State of Colorado historically subsidized higher education for in-state students by giving money directly to the colleges. In 2004, the Colorado Legislature enacted a new law establishing the College Opportunity Fund (COF). Under this new law, the State gives this money for the subsidy to students by sending it to the institution the student designates. This money, known as College Opportunity Fund stipends, will be applied to an in-state student’s tuition if the student applies for and authorizes the use of the stipend. The college you are attending will receive the money and it will appear as a credit on your tuition bill. Currently the College Opportunity Fund (COF) stipend is estimated to be worth \$31.00 per credit hour.

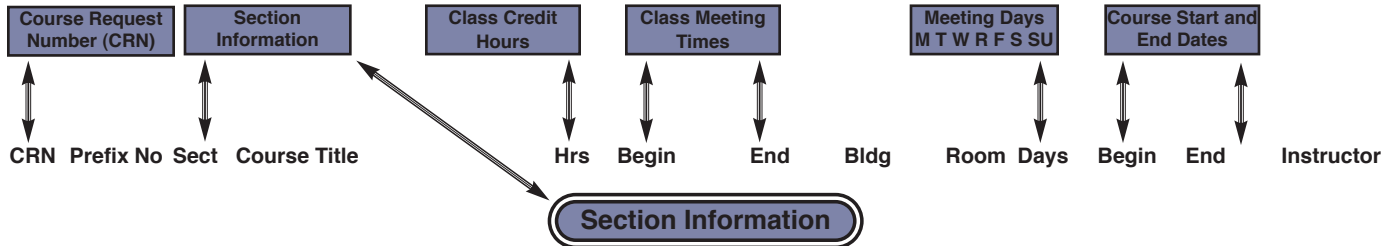

Step 2: Assessment

Colorado Community Colleges are required by law to assess basic skills for all new students. Individuals must complete the ACCUPLACER Placement exam before registering for classes. ACCUPLACER tests are provided daily in the Woods Student Success Center in Library 207d, located on the main floor of the Freudenthal Library or in the Learning Resource Center (LRC) on the second floor in Room 212 on the Valley Campus. Visit www.trinidadstate.edu to find the daily testing schedule, or call 719-846-5477 for more information. In the Valley call 719-589-7058.

Students are exempt from ACCUPLACER testing if they meet one of the following criteria:

- Hold a degree from an accredited college or university
- Successful previous college credit in freshman English composition and college Algebra
- Acceptable SAT or ACT scores taken within the last two years
- Are enrolling in only one course for employment enhancement or personal enjoyment

Students MUST 1) have applied to TSJC, and 2) present a valid state-issued photo ID to take the ACCUPLACER test.

Step 3: Advising

You will meet with advising staff to help you select your course of study. Your area of study will determine which advisor will be permanently assigned to you. To insure that you stay on track, you will meet with your advisor each semester and again if you decide to change your course of study. Step 4: Registration

On-campus registration may be accomplished in the Student Services Office. To register for a class that has already begun, you must submit a schedule adjustment form with an instructor's signature to the Student Services Office. Questions? Registration Materials

Registration materials are available in the Student Services Office. Registration forms should be completed with a ballpoint pen. Illegible, incomplete, or incorrect registration forms will be returned to the student to be corrected before being processed.

Advising and Testing

Students without sufficient ACT or SAT scores must complete the Accuplacer Assessment before registering. Appointments for entrance Accuplacer Assessment can be made in person at the Woods Student Success Center, in Library 300, or by calling 719-846-5477 or in the Valley at the LRC in Room 212 or call 719-589-7058. You will be assigned an advisor appropriate to your declared area of study. Meet with your advisor when selecting your course of study. Obtain the approval of your advisor for your schedule of courses. Students who have difficulty selecting an area of emphasis or who wish to change their course of study should visit an advisor.

Credit Hours

To be considered a full-time student, you must be enrolled in at least 12 credit hours. If you are a full-time vocational student, you may not take more than 28 credit hours without the approval of the dean.

Check Your Requirements

To earn a degree, students must satisfy all course and curriculum requirements for the curriculum under which they are registered and attain a cumulative grade point average of 2.0 or higher. Basic skills courses do not count toward a degree. Familiarize yourself with the provisions and regulations pertaining to your program. See your advisor when in doubt. TSJC will make every effort to assist you in meeting requirements for graduation. **Final responsibility, however, rests with you.**

Course Cancellations

The College reserves the right to cancel programs or courses, to change instructors, and to change times or locations of classes. The dean's office will have current, up-to-date information on scheduled classes.

Arranged Courses

The abbreviation "TBA" means that the time, days, or locations are scheduled on an individual basis between student and instructor. Students are responsible for seeing the instructor to arrange their schedules.

Change of Grade

A change of grade or removal of an "I" (incomplete) is made by the course instructor. Approval must be obtained from the appropriate dean before the change can be recorded.

Dropping a Class

If you officially drop from all classes prior to census date (the last day to drop a class without penalty), a 100% refund of tuition will be made. There will be no refund if the student withdraws after the class census date. To be eligible for tuition refunds, students must officially drop the credit hours through the Student Services Office and apply for the refund by presenting the completed documents to the Business Office.

Transferability

Trinidad State Junior College has transfer agreements with Colorado's four-year colleges and universities. These agreements ensure that if you successfully complete requirements for graduation with an Associate of Arts or Associate of Science Degree, you have fulfilled general education requirements and you will be granted upper division status at the receiving institution.

Withdrawing from a Class

It is the student's responsibility to drop or withdraw from classes if they stop attending. Please go to the Student Services Office to drop or withdraw from a class.

If you decide to withdraw from a class after the census date, but before the last 20% of the class,

and have a passing grade, your grade will be recorded as "W." A "W" is not counted in computing grade point averages. If you withdraw during the last 20% of the class, you will be assigned a regular grade that does count in computing grade point averages. Requests for exception to this policy may be made to the appropriate dean.

If you withdraw from a class after census date, you will not receive a refund of your tuition for the class. Moreover, a record of your having enrolled in the class will be created. If you have a passing grade when you withdraw, your instructor will report a grade of "W," which will appear on your transcript, but will not affect your overall grade point average.

Tuition Classification

Colorado law requires that you be classified as in state or out-of-state for tuition purposes. Your tuition classification is based upon information you supply on your application for admission.

Students previously classified as out-of-state may have their classification changed through a Tuition Classification Petition process. Petitions and information concerning documentation may be obtained in the Student Services Office. Petition applications must be received by the Registrar's Office by the first Friday of class each semester.

Student Health Insurance

Trinidad State Junior College offers several

health insurance plans. TSJC does not require health insurance for non-athletes. However, all student athletes must show proof of a student health plan. The Valley Campus does not offer sports.

Military/Veterans and Their Families

Trinidad State Junior College takes pride in being able to meet the educational needs of military service members, their families and veterans, and is approved by the Colorado State Approving Agency for Veterans Education. Military tuition assistance, veterans education benefits, and veterans vocational rehabilitation are administered by the Financial Aid office on both campuses.

Each semester, active duty military members and veterans using or wanting to use educational benefits must report to the Financial Aid Office after completing the enrollment process. To maintain your educational benefits in good standing with your Service and/or the Department of Veterans Affairs you must immediately inform the Financial Aid office if you:

- drop, add or audit classes;
- stop attending classes;
- have a class cancelled, withdraw or are withdrawn from classes or the college;
- are unable to attend classes or;
- make any changes to your enrollment status.

If you are a military dependent or the dependent of a disable veteran you may be eligible for a

variety of educational benefits. We recommend that you visit one of our Financial Aid Offices for more information.

For more information on these and other programs, visit your campus Financial Aid Office.

Selective Service Registration

In March, 1987, the Colorado legislature enacted a law that stipulates "no male person born after December 31, 1959, shall be eligible to enroll at any state-supported institution of higher education until such person has filed with such institution a statement of (selective service) registration compliance."

In order to comply with the provisions of this statute, all male students at Trinidad State Junior College born after December 31, 1959, must submit a compliance statement to the Office of Student Services. All new applicants may use a special form or answer the questions about selective service on their application for admission. Registration will not be complete for any male student born after December 31, 1959, until he has complied with the law.

Parking Regulations

There are restricted parking areas on campus. Signs or painted curbs indicate these:

Student Rights

David Barrack enjoys teaching

If you happen to have other business in the Boyd Technology Building while David Barrack is teaching a graphic design class, you may observe students earnestly at work at Mac computers equipped with the most recent design software. Inadvertently overhearing Barrack as he teaches, you might even start following along as he takes complicated instructions and clearly breaks them down into understandable steps, pausing frequently to ask if anyone has any questions.

If you could see through the partition, you would see him walking quietly and slowly from student to student, making sure that everyone is following along, clearing up any questions. It is a quiet classroom, even harmonious.

David Barrack is one of those natural-born teachers with the gift of conveying and communicating his knowledge of the subject at hand both eloquently, yet simply, to his students.

After class, you might observe Barrack in the back of the room with a student or two, taking the time to answer a question, set up an extra lab or make-up quiz. Or, you might see him doing the same in the hallways of the Berg Building where he teaches both Macro and Micro Economics.

His co-workers describe him as energetic, inquisitive, hard-working and knowledgeable.

David Barrack is one of those 'profs' that you'll always remember. He's young at heart, with a twinkle in his eye. He has an easy manner. He teases and jokes. He reminds you of a college kid himself, but a little gray here and there tells you he's not.

In class, he's smart and prepared. He'll make you think, and he's kind of proud of being considered 'tough.' "I am responsible for preparing my students for a 4-year school and the working world and I expect them to do their work knowing the difference between being mediocre and exceptional," he said.

Barrack is no doubt projecting some of the values of his Catholic school education, and a strong work ethic from his parents. He attended Mt. Carmel School from K-8 and graduated from Trinidad Catholic High School.



He started working at age 13 for his father's automobile dealership.

He attended Trinidad State Junior College and received an associate degree in Business in 1974. He transferred to Colorado State University (CSU) in Fort Collins where he received a bachelor of science in Business Administration and remained at CSU to earn a master degree in Business Administration in 1978.

After college, Barrack worked in Fort Collins and Denver for several years before returning home to Trinidad where he has spent 30 years as a self-employed businessman, as the owner/manager/appraiser of a real estate company, the owner of a self-service car wash, and as a computer network/software/IT consultant for newspapers.

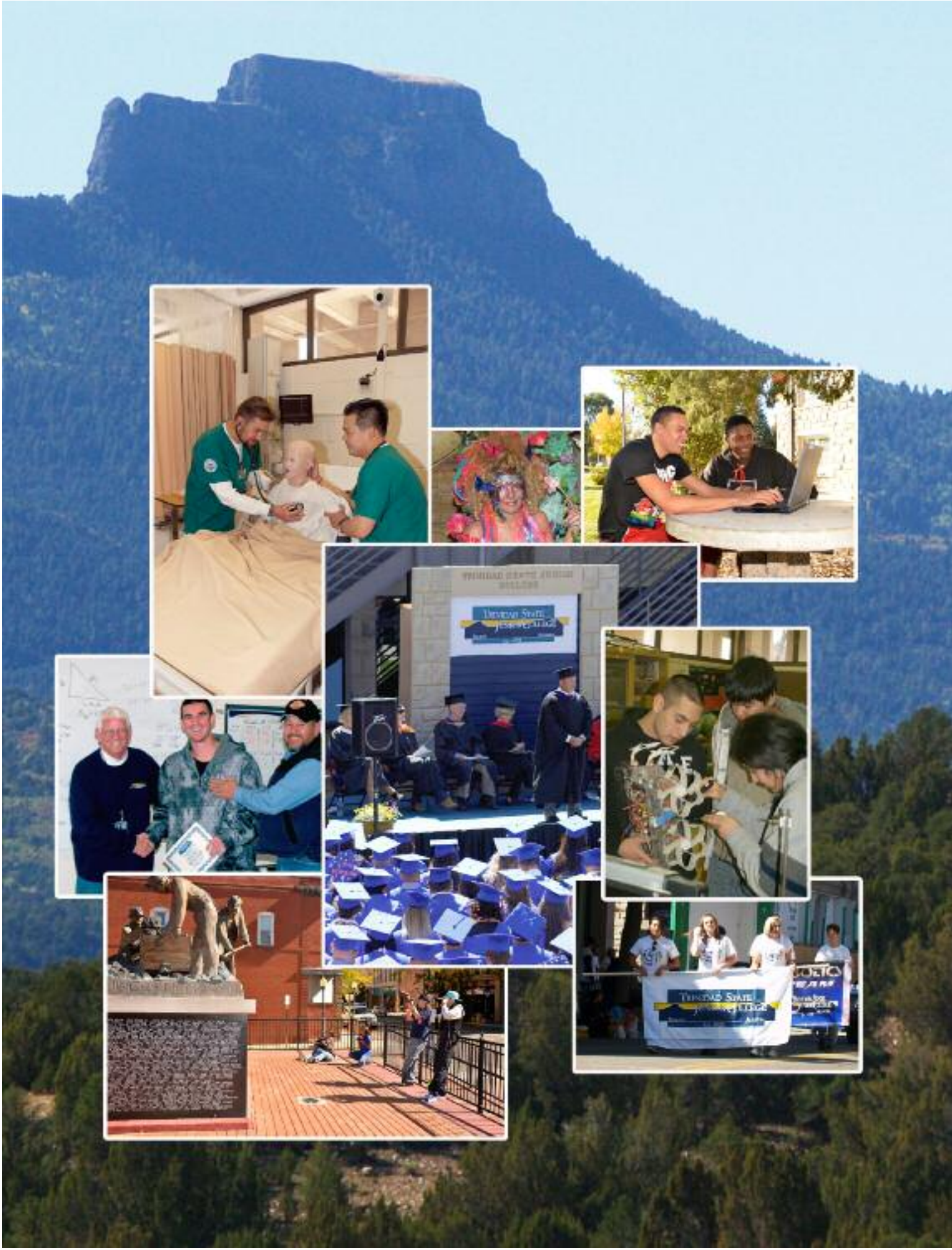
Barrack is a self-taught computer geek with a local reputation of experience with design software and print pre-press, and in August, 2006

TSJC administration tapped him to start teaching a variety of graphic design courses as an adjunct faculty member. He started doing the lay-out for the college catalog and class schedules for both of TSJC's campuses at that time, too. The next year he started teaching economics and became a full-time faculty member.

Another element of Barrack's innate ability to interest his students is that he teaches classes for which he has a passion and a long-time personal interest.

He is frequently seen around campus taking photos, and he is also teaching a digital photography class this year. His parents gave him his first camera, a Kodak Brownie, when he was 7 years old and he bought his first 35mm when he was 16, which he used primarily for journalism and sports reporting in high school. In fact, he said, photography is still his main hobby today. He enjoys nothing better than getting away to the mountains to photograph landscapes, plants and wildlife, sunrises and sunsets.

Barrack said that his selection as Faculty of the Year by his peers was a surprise and an honor, and that he is surrounded by exceptional instructors and could not do his job without the excellent staff at the college. He said he really enjoys the students and the opportunities to learn that he gains from working at TSJC. "I enjoy teaching so much it's like not working," he said.
