The State of Colorado historically subsidized higher education for in-state students by giving money directly to the colleges. In 2004, the Colorado Legislature enacted a new law establishing the College Opportunity Fund (COF). Under this new law, the State gives this money for the subsidy to students by sending it to the institution the student designates. This money, known as College Opportunity Fund stipends, will be applied to an in-state student's tuition if the student applies for and authorizes the use of the stipend. The college you are attending will receive the money and it will appear as a credit on your tuition bill. Currently the College Opportunity Fund (COF) stipend is estimated to be worth \$31.00 per credit hour.

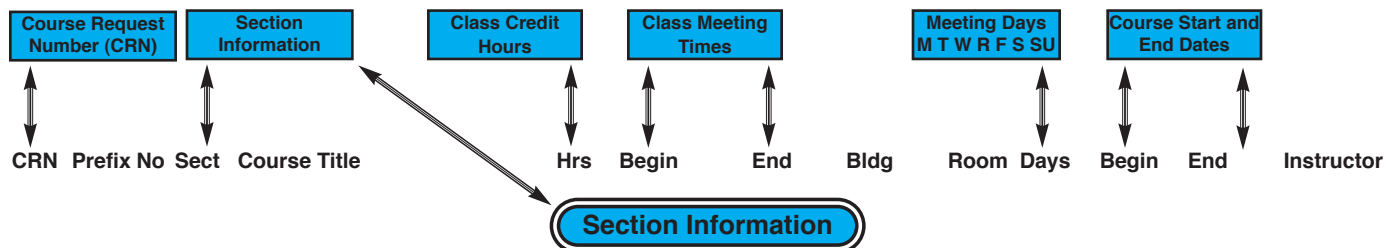

Step 2: Assessment

Colorado Community Colleges are required by law to assess basic skills for all new students. Individuals must complete the ACCUPLACER Placement exam before registering for classes. ACCUPLACER tests are provided daily in the Woods Student Success Center, located on the main floor of the Library or for the Valley in the Learning Resource Center (LRC) on the second floor in Room 212. That number is 719-589-7088.

Students are exempt from ACCUPLACER testing if they meet one of the following criteria:

- Hold a degree from an accredited college or university
- Successful previous college credit in freshman English composition and college Algebra
- Acceptable SAT or ACT scores taken within the last two years
- Are enrolling in only one course for employment enhancement or personal enjoyment

Students MUST 1) have applied to TSJC, and 2) present a photo ID to take the ACCUPLACER test. The Valley student needs to have applied to TSJC and their S Number (Student Number) is required, but not a photo ID.

Students without required ACT or SAT scores must complete the ACCUPLACER assessment before registering for classes. Testing takes place daily in the Woods Student Success Center, in Library 207d; or in the Valley at the above LRC location. Visit www.trinidadstate.edu to find the daily testing schedule, or call 719-846-5477 for more information. In the Valley call 719-589-7088. Application for Admission

Full-time students who have not previously attended Trinidad State Junior College are required to complete an Application for Admission.

Immunization Requirements

Colorado Law requires that all full-time students born after January 1, 1957, show proof of immunization against measles, mumps, and rubella. Students residing in student housing are required to show proof of immunization against meningococcal disease or the student or parent/guardian must sign a waiver. Proof of immunization is required at the time of registration. Certification forms are available at the Student Services Office. In the Valley an arrangement with Adams State College allows TSJC students to reside in the dorms on that nearby campus.

Registration Materials

Registration materials are available in the Student Services Office. Registration forms should be completed with a ballpoint pen. Illegible, incomplete, or incorrect registration forms will be returned to the student to be corrected before being processed.

Advising and Testing

Students without sufficient ACT or SAT scores must complete the Accuplacer Assessment before registering. Appointments for entrance Accuplacer Assessment can be made in person at the Woods Student Success Center, in Library 300, or by calling 719-846-5477 or in the Valley at the LRC in Room 212 or call 719-589-7058. You will be assigned an advisor appropriate to your declared area of study. Meet with your advisor when selecting your course of study. Obtain the approval of your advisor for your schedule of courses. Students who have difficulty selecting an area of emphasis or who wish to change their course of study should visit an advisor.

Credit Hours

To be considered a full-time student, you must be enrolled in at least 12 credit hours. If you are a full-time vocational student, you may not take more than 28 credit hours without the approval of the dean.

Check Your Requirements

To earn a degree, students must satisfy all course and curriculum requirements for the curriculum under which they are registered and attain a cumulative grade point average of 2.0 or higher. Basic skills courses do not count toward a degree. Familiarize yourself with the provisions and regulations pertaining to your program. See your advisor when in doubt. TSJC will make every effort to assist you in meeting requirements for graduation. **Final responsibility, however, rests with you.**

Course Cancellations

The College reserves the right to cancel programs or courses, to change instructors, and to change times or locations of classes. The dean's office will have current, up-to-date information on scheduled classes.

Arranged Courses

The abbreviation "TBA" means that the time, days, or locations are scheduled on an individual

basis between student and instructor. Students are responsible for seeing the instructor to arrange their schedules.

Change of Grade

A change of grade or removal of an "I" (incomplete) is made by the course instructor. Approval must be obtained from the appropriate dean before the change can be recorded.

Dropping a Class

If you officially drop from all classes prior to census date (the last day to drop a class without penalty), a 100% refund of tuition will be made. There will be no refund if the student withdraws after the class census date. To be eligible for tuition refunds, students must officially drop the credit hours through the Student Services Office and apply for the refund by presenting the completed documents to the Business Office.

Transferability

Trinidad State Junior College has transfer agreements with Colorado's four-year colleges and universities. These agreements ensure that if you successfully complete requirements for graduation with an Associate of Arts or Associate of Science Degree, you have fulfilled general education requirements and you will be granted upper division status at the receiving institution.

Third party sponsor: If tuition and fees are to be paid by a third party, provide a copy of the authorization to the Business Office at the time of registration.

Deferred payment plan: TSJC provides a deferred payment plan through NelNet Business Solutions. Go to www.trinidadstate.edu, designate a campus, select Business Office in the Quick Links and click on the e-cashier logo.

Withdrawing from a Class

It is the student's responsibility to drop or withdraw from classes if they stop attending. Please go to the Student Services Office to drop or withdraw from a class.

If you decide to withdraw from a class after the census date, but before the last 20% of the class, and have a passing grade, your grade will be recorded as "W." A "W" is not counted in computing grade point averages. If you withdraw during the last 20% of the class, you will be assigned a regular grade that does count in computing grade point averages. Requests for exception to this policy may be made to the appropriate dean.

If you withdraw from a class after census date, you will not receive a refund of your tuition for the class. Moreover, a record of your having enrolled in the class will be created. If you have a passing grade when you withdraw, your instructor will report a grade of "W," which will appear on your transcript, but will not affect your overall grade point average.

Tuition Classification

Colorado law requires that you be classified as in state or out-of-state for tuition purposes. Your tuition classification is based upon information you supply on your application for admission.

Students previously classified as out-of-state may have their classification changed through a Tuition Classification Petition process. Petitions and information concerning documentation may be obtained in the Student Services Office.

All Colorado resident students are eligible, but you must sign up to receive COF funds.

Tuition and fees are subject to change depending on legislative and state board action. Therefore, TSJC reserves the right to change the amount of tuition and fees pursuant to such actions. Specific courses may have additional charges.

Student Health Insurance

Trinidad State Junior College offers several health insurance plans. TSJC does not require health insurance for non-athletes. However, all student athletes must show proof of a student health plan. The Valley Campus does not offer sports.

Veterans

The Veterans Counselor, located in the Financial Aid Office, must sign registration forms for students applying for VA benefits before their registration is complete. In the Valley see Financial Aid in the Student Services Office (Rm 160) or call 580-7024.

Selective Service Registration

In March, 1987, the Colorado legislature enacted a law that stipulates "no male person born after December 31, 1959, shall be eligible to enroll at any state-supported institution of higher education until such person has filed with such institution a statement of (selective service) registration compliance."

In order to comply with the provisions of this statute, all male students at Trinidad State Junior College born after December 31, 1959, must submit a compliance statement to the Office of Student Services. All new applicants may use a special form or answer the questions about selective service on their application for admission. Registration will not be complete for any male student born after December 31, 1959, until he has complied with the law.

Parking Regulations

There are restricted parking areas on campus. Signs or painted curbs indicate these:

- Yellow curbs—No Parking Areas
- Red curbs—Fire Safety Zone
- Handicapped Zones are marked in blue and reserved for persons who have handicapped stickers on or in their car.

Parking violators will be ticketed and habitual parking violators will have their cars towed away at the owner's expense.

Parking in the red fire zones is subject to immediate towing without a warning or ticket.

Student Rights

Under the provision of the Federal Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 (commonly called the Buckley Amendment), students have a right to inspect and review their records. Requests for such inspection and review may be made to the Student Services Office.

Under the terms of the Act as amended, Trinidad State Junior College is required to publish the personal "Directory Information" on its students. This information will be released

without your consent unless you have asked that your prior consent be obtained. Directory information includes your name, address, telephone number, date of birth, major field of study, class level, dates of attendance, photographs, and degrees received.

If you do not want this information released, you must make a written request in the Student Services Office before the end of the first week of classes. Your request will remain in effect until you formally cancel it.

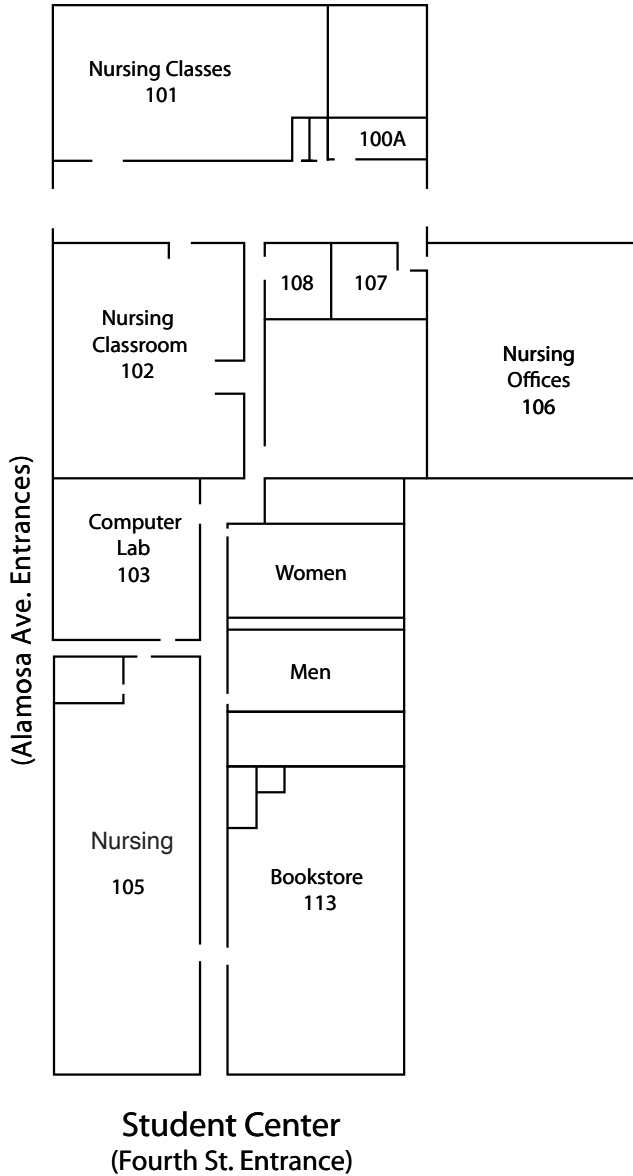
TSJC Cares!

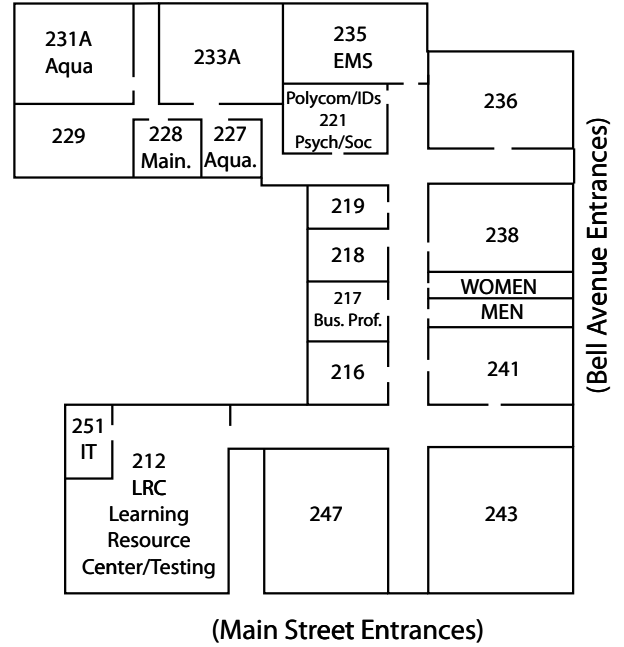

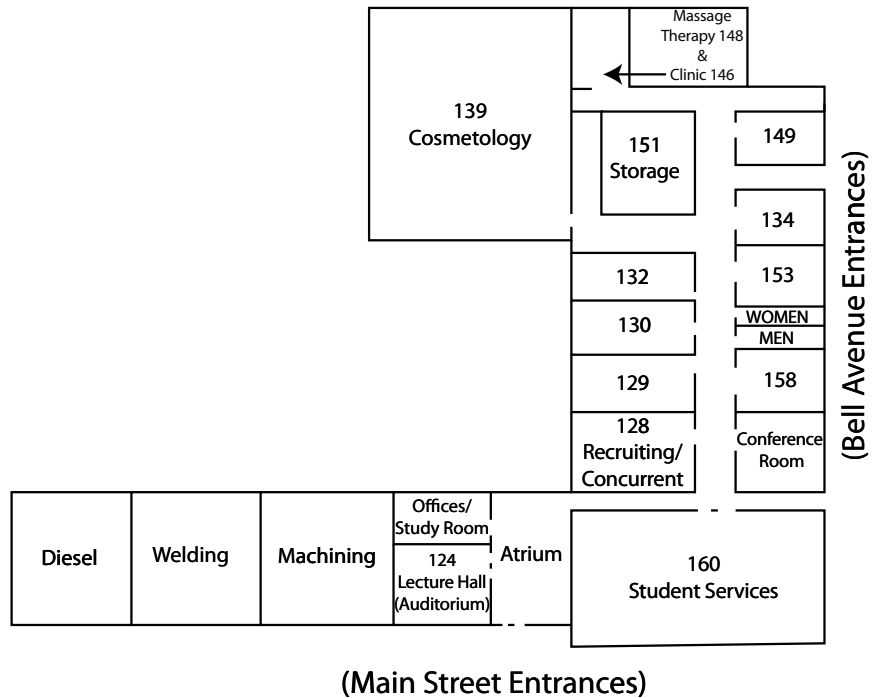
Campus Room Numbers

From homeless to a new beginning...

...It's never too late to start or start over.

Kicheal Langford is a gutsy lady who was born and raised in Albuquerque. She married right out of high school, had three children, and ultimately separated and then divorced from her husband. By that time she had worked for twenty-five years in grocery stores. "I enjoyed the people, but I just hated the odd hours and the heavy lifting was tiring," she said, "but I didn't realize financial aid was available for higher education. I didn't know I had a choice."

After the separation, Langford lost her home, and she and two of her children stayed in a woman's shelter for three months and then moved to a friend's trailer in the mountains where they lived for about six months without running water, utilities or a vehicle. She was desperate.

With help from her grandmother and a cousin, she and her two children moved to the San Luis Valley in 1996 while her oldest girl continued living with her husband. "I didn't have a dime to my name," Langford said when she moved to Sanford. The kind owner of a country store there graciously allowed Langford, along with her two children, to move in to a rental next door to his store. Langford's cousin's husband then hired her to work at his meat processing plant. In time she left that job to work at Jack's Market in La Jara.

Meanwhile, parents of a school friend of her daughter's wanted to sell an older vehicle they owned. They knew that Langford had no means of transportation. She happily agreed to their offer to allow her to make payments and she became the proud owner of her own car.

Langford worked at Jack's Market for four years until an automobile accident her daughter was involved in left her with \$25 a week for living expenses. Her income was being garnished to pay for accident-related expenses. Wondering how they were going to survive, she saw an ad in the paper about a Trio program which offered help with college applications, including FAFSA forms, to non-traditional students. After investigating and with encouragement from a Trio employee, Langford applied and then enrolled at the Trinidad State Junior College Valley Campus in Alamosa beginning her education there in June of 1999. She was



terrified. She had no idea how to turn on a computer, and when the instructor said "take your mouse" she had no idea what "mouse" meant as she quickly scanned the floor looking for a mouse. But she persevered and graduated in May of 2001 with an AAS degree in Office Technologies. Langford was hired part-time at TSJC that June to assist Anna Mae Rael-Lindsay with the ABE/GED/ESL programs which Rael-Lindsay oversees as Director of the TSJC Learning Resource Center. In 2003 following in her mother's footsteps, Langford's oldest daughter, Bianca, earned her AAS degree in Office Technologies at TSJC.

After three years of working part-time and not yet employed full-time, Langford decided she had the time to pursue a BA degree and enrolled at Adams State College in 2002 to begin that process. During this time, she realized her longing for her own home and, she, along with her two youngest children, moved in to her self-help home in Alamosa. "I wouldn't have a home without the help I received from the Colorado Rural Housing Development," she said.

In 2006 Langford began working full-time at TSJC. She continues working with the Learning Resource Center and is the GED Chief Examiner. In addition she now assists part-time in the Student Services' office as well. She often works with students as they begin the financial aid application process. Just recently a woman who had been laid off came in to register for an Excel class. She was so nervous she was shaking, but Langford gently encouraged her as she shared her own story. Ultimately, the woman registered as a full-time student and has since thanked Langford repeatedly as she happily pursues a degree at TSJC.

Langford's daughter, Brenea, earned her CNA certificate from TSJC in 2008 and her son Brandon is just two courses short of his AAS degree in Graphic Design. After this semester and her math class, Langford is only 18 credit hours away from a BA in Business Management. "No one in my family has a BA," Langford said, "I just didn't realize that financial aid was available for higher education. It's pretty awesome when your mind opens up and you realize you can learn and actually make A's!" Kicheal continues to pay it forward as she shares her experience and encouragement with others in similar circumstances.
