The State of Colorado historically subsidized higher education for in-state students by giving money directly to the colleges. In 2004, the Colorado Legislature enacted a new law establishing the College Opportunity Fund (COF). Under this new law, the State gives this money for the subsidy to students by sending it to the institution the student designates. This money, known as College Opportunity Fund stipends, will be applied to an in-state student’s tuition if the student applies for and authorizes the use of the stipend. The college you are attending will receive the money and it will appear as a credit on your tuition bill. Currently the College Opportunity Fund (COF) stipend is estimated to be worth \$62.00 per credit hour.

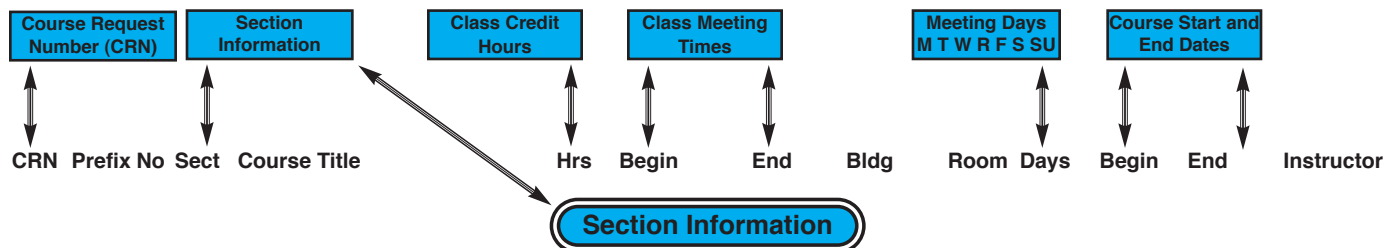

Colorado Community Colleges are required by law to assess basic skills for all new students. Individuals must complete the ACCUPLACER Placement exam before registering for classes. ACCUPLACER tests are provided daily in the Woods Student Success Center in Library 207d, located on the main floor of the Freudenthal Library or in the Learning Resource Center (LRC) on the second floor in Room 212 on the Valley Campus. Visit www.trinidadstate.edu to find the daily testing schedule, or call 719-846-5477 for more information. In the Valley call 719-589-7058.

Students are exempt from ACCUPLACER testing if they meet one of the following criteria:

- Hold a degree from an accredited college or university
- Successful previous college credit in freshman English composition and college Algebra
- Acceptable SAT or ACT scores taken within the last two years
- Are enrolling in only one course for employment enhancement or personal enjoyment

Students MUST 1) have applied to TSJC, and 2) present a valid state-issued photo ID to take the ACCUPLACER test.

Step 3: Advising

You will meet with advising staff to help you select your course of study. Your area of study will determine which advisor will be permanently assigned to you. To insure that you stay on track, you will meet with your advisor each semester and again if you decide to change your course of study. Registration Materials

Registration materials are available in the Student Services Office. Registration forms should be completed with a ballpoint pen. Illegible, incomplete, or incorrect registration forms will be returned to the student to be corrected before being processed.

Advising and Testing

Students without sufficient ACT or SAT scores must complete the Accuplacer Assessment before registering. Appointments for entrance Accuplacer Assessment can be made in person at the Woods Student Success Center, in Library 300, or by calling 719-846-5477 or in the Valley at the LRC in Room 212 or call 719-589-7058. You will be assigned an advisor appropriate to your declared area of study. Meet with your advisor when selecting your course of study. Obtain the approval of your advisor for your schedule of courses. Students who have difficulty selecting an area of emphasis or who wish to change their course of study should visit an advisor.

Credit Hours

To be considered a full-time student, you must be enrolled in at least 12 credit hours. If you are a full-time vocational student, you may not take more than 28 credit hours without the approval of the dean.

Check Your Requirements

To earn a degree, students must satisfy all course and curriculum requirements for the curriculum under which they are registered and attain a cumulative grade point average of 2.0 or higher. Basic skills courses do not count toward a degree. Familiarize yourself with the provisions and regulations pertaining to your program. See your advisor when in doubt. TSJC will make every effort to assist you in meeting requirements for graduation. **Final responsibility, however, rests with you.**

Course Cancellations

The College reserves the right to cancel programs or courses, to change instructors, and to change times or locations of classes. The dean's office will have current, up-to-date information on scheduled classes.

Arranged Courses

The abbreviation "TBA" means that the time, days, or locations are scheduled on an individual basis between student and instructor. Students are responsible for seeing the instructor to arrange their schedules.

Change of Grade

A change of grade or removal of an "I" (incomplete) is made by the course instructor. Approval must be obtained from the appropriate dean before the change can be recorded.

Dropping a Class

If you officially drop from all classes prior to census date (the last day to drop a class without penalty), a 100% refund of tuition will be made. There will be no refund if the student withdraws after the class census date. To be eligible for tuition refunds, students must officially drop the credit hours through the Student Services Office and apply for the refund by presenting the completed documents to the Business Office.

Transferability

Trinidad State Junior College has transfer agreements with Colorado's four-year colleges and universities. These agreements ensure that if you successfully complete requirements for graduation with an Associate of Arts or Associate of Science Degree, you have fulfilled general education requirements and you will be granted upper division status at the receiving institution.

Withdrawing from a Class

It is the student's responsibility to drop or withdraw from classes if they stop attending. Please go to the Student Services Office to drop or withdraw from a class.

If you decide to withdraw from a class after the census date, but before the last 20% of the class,

and have a passing grade, your grade will be recorded as “W.” A “W” is not counted in computing grade point averages. If you withdraw during the last 20% of the class, you will be assigned a regular grade that does count in computing grade point averages. Requests for exception to this policy may be made to the appropriate dean.

If you withdraw from a class after census date, you will not receive a refund of your tuition for the class. Moreover, a record of your having enrolled in the class will be created. If you have a passing grade when you withdraw, your instructor will report a grade of “W,” which will appear on your transcript, but will not affect your overall grade point average.

Tuition Classification

Colorado law requires that you be classified as in state or out-of-state for tuition purposes. Your tuition classification is based upon information you supply on your application for admission.

Students previously classified as out-of-state may have their classification changed through a Tuition Classification Petition process. Petitions and information concerning documentation may be obtained in the Student Services Office. Petition applications must be received by the Registrar’s Office by the first Friday of class each semester.

Student Health Insurance

Trinidad State Junior College offers several

health insurance plans. TSJC does not require health insurance for non-athletes. However, all student athletes must show proof of a student health plan. The Valley Campus does not offer sports.

Military/Veterans and Their Families

Trinidad State Junior College takes pride in being able to meet the educational needs of military service members, their families and veterans, and is approved by the Colorado State Approving Agency for Veterans Education. Military tuition assistance, veterans education benefits, and veterans vocational rehabilitation are administered by the Financial Aid office on both campuses.

Each semester, active duty military members and veterans using or wanting to use educational benefits must report to the Financial Aid Office after completing the enrollment process. To maintain your educational benefits in good standing with your Service and/or the Department of Veterans Affairs you must immediately inform the Financial Aid office if you:

- drop, add or audit classes;
- stop attending classes;
- have a class cancelled, withdraw or are withdrawn from classes or the college;
- are unable to attend classes or;
- make any changes to your enrollment status.

If you are a military dependent or the dependent of a disabled veteran you may be eligible for a variety of educational benefits. We recommend

that you visit one of our Financial Aid Offices for more information.

For more information on these and other programs, visit your campus Financial Aid Office.

Selective Service Registration

In March, 1987, the Colorado legislature enacted a law that stipulates “no male person born after December 31, 1959, shall be eligible to enroll at any state-supported institution of higher education until such person has filed with such institution a statement of (selective service) registration compliance.”

In order to comply with the provisions of this statute, all male students at Trinidad State Junior College born after December 31, 1959, must submit a compliance statement to the Office of Student Services. All new applicants may use a special form or answer the questions about selective service on their application for admission. Registration will not be complete for any male student born after December 31, 1959, until he has complied with the law.

Parking Regulations

There are restricted parking areas on campus.

If you do not want this information released, you must make a written request in the Student Services Office before the end of the first week of classes. Your request will remain in effect until you formally cancel it.

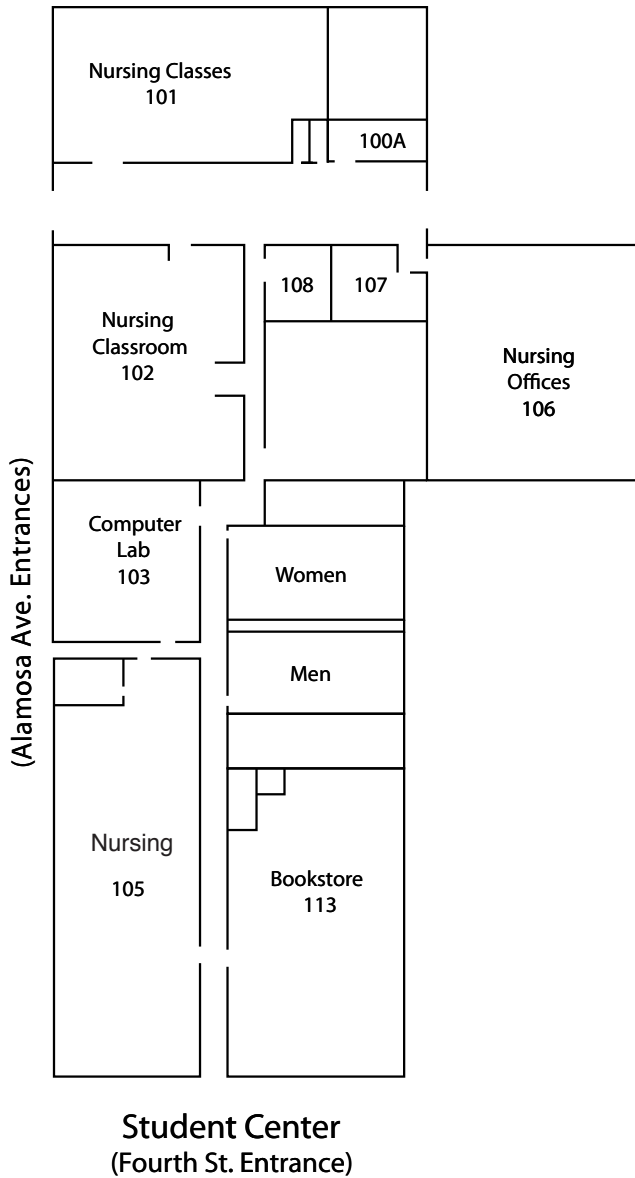
TSJC Cares!

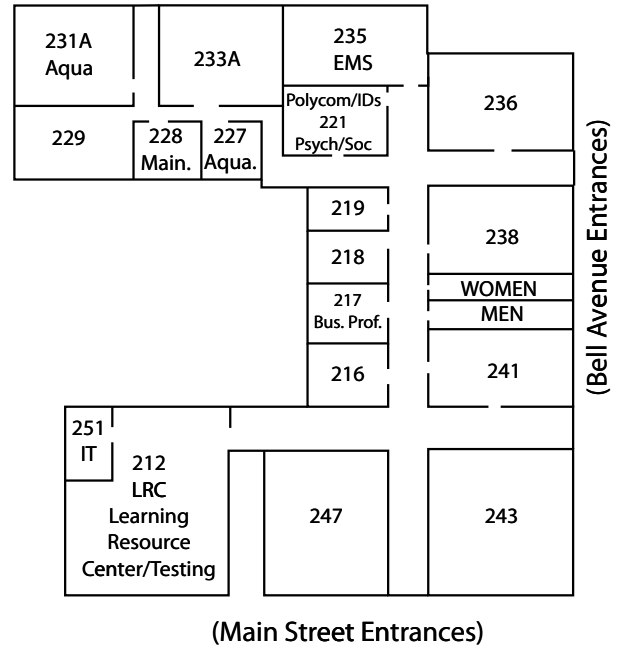

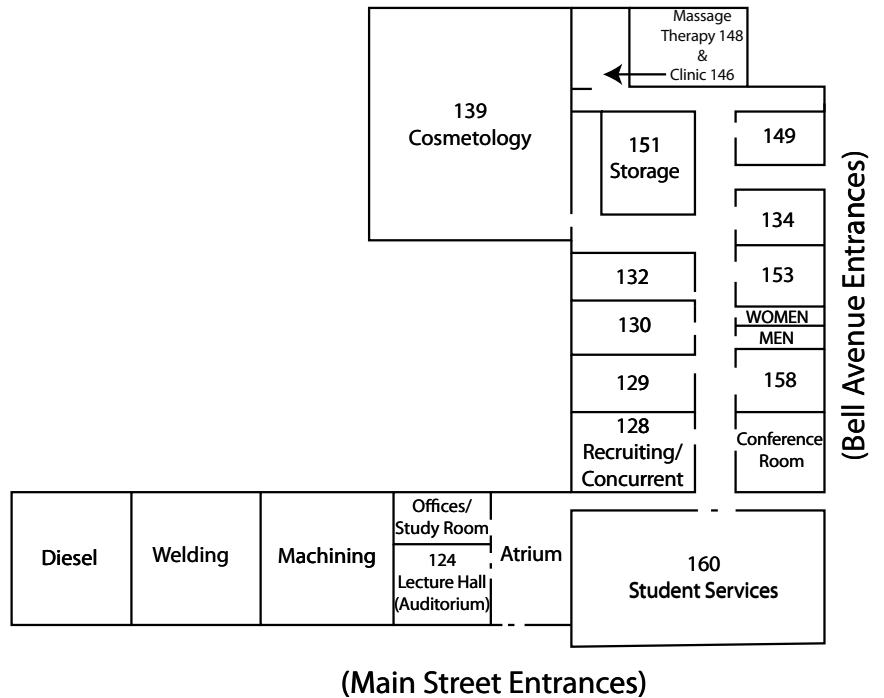
Campus Room Numbers

TSJC selects Louise Sowards as Valley Campus Faculty Member of the Year

Louise Sowards, Director of Nursing for Trinidad State Junior College, began her career with TSJC as a nursing instructor in 1996. She became the Nursing Program Coordinator for the Valley campus in 2006, and was promoted to Director of Nursing in 2009.

Sowards received her MSN from the University of Colorado, her bachelor degree from Regis University, and her ADN from Mesa State College in Grand Junction. Prior to joining TSJC, she worked as a staff nurse and as the Assistant Director of Nursing for sixteen years.

TSJC's nursing program is offered at both of its campuses and Sowards divides her time equally between Alamosa and

Trinidad. She is enthusiastic about the nursing education the college offers. "We have a committed, dedicated faculty who believe in student success and student support, while maintaining high expectations and high standards," she said.

Besides supervising a department of fifteen employees, she is also responsible for ensuring that the curriculum is followed, classes are scheduled, required reports are filed, and for recruiting and orienting new faculty as the program continues to grow.

She also stays in touch with the nursing students and keeps up with her teaching skills by teaching a weekly 'med-surg' class on both campuses.

As the program director, she is always looking at the big picture for the future and working to advance the program. In 2009, the nursing programs of Trinidad State Junior College in partnership with Otero Junior College were awarded a competitive three-year federal grant to increase the number of nursing students that can be trained, thereby providing needed nursing

personnel for rural southern Colorado communities. This grant has made it possible to add to the college's training capacity by funding additional instructors and purchasing classroom infrastructure such as high tech simulation equipment.

An important goal that Sowards has had for the TSJC Nursing Program is very close to fulfillment.

For the past two years the nursing program has been pursuing national accreditation by the National League of Nursing Accreditation. Following an extensive accreditation site visit October 11 and 12, TSJC satisfactorily met the requirements of the six standards required to advance to the next level of review to receive the national accreditation.

The next big project Sowards is working on is the development of a pilot part-time evening and weekend nursing program for the Trinidad campus.

Despite the long hours and a challenging workload, Sowards says she has the energy to keep up with it because of her passion for nursing education. "I believe in students. I believe in Trinidad State Junior College. I believe in the community college philosophy and the accomplishments of nursing students I have witnessed," she said.

She is also enthusiastic about the mutual cooperation between herself and the nursing faculty and the supportive administration. "My faculty and administrative assistants, my deans, President Lopez...they help me in every way possible, and I would do anything for them," she said.

Sowards grew up on a ranch in Alamosa. Her husband is a native of the San Luis Valley, too. They live in Manassa where they are still in the ranching business. "I could not do everything I do without the support of my family," she said. When she is home she loves to cross stitch, knit, ride horses, and do things with her five grandchildren.
