
ONLINE NON-CREDIT COURSES

While computers have simplified tasks in the workplace, in some cases they have also resulted in a workforce that lacks writing skills. In the workplace, writing must be understandable to the public, other businesses, and even government agencies. Professionals do not accept the slang and abbreviations used in emails; rather, they expect professional documents that clearly convey important messages.

This course will focus on the written communication needs of registered students in order to for them to become successful (or to remain successful) in the workplace.

Handling Difficult Employee Behavior

Online course 10 contact hours, 1 CEU or 10 SHRM credits

Handling difficult employee behavior can be overwhelming as you try to navigate the psychology of poor behavior to figure out how to improve the situation. This course is designed to prepare managers to deal with troublesome and difficult behavior by employees. By effectively addressing, coaching, and counseling employees, you can improve their behavior and improve morale, staff retention, productivity, and teamwork. This course uses videos to illustrate each

behavior type so that you can more easily apply the techniques to your current work environment. Focusing on dealing with the behavior (not the person), tools and techniques for positive change are clear and welldefined.
