A Family Legacy—David and Marlene Pratto

Bertha Bon Pratto was born into the mining community of Starkville, Colorado in 1908. Mining was the town's principal economic activity in those days, and through the years the small community would experience the industry's characteristic boom-and-bust cycles. It would also endure its associated risks. In 1910, an explosion at the Starkville mine would kill 56 miners.

Bertha Pratto would grow up and live a large portion of her life in the coal camps and farming communities of Starkville, Delagua, Trujillo Creek, Gulnare, and Aguilar. **Read More**

A non-profit corporation founded in 1968, the Trinidad State College Foundation promotes the growth and development of Trinidad State College by providing support for scholarships, academics, student Once upon a time, the concept of an unmanned aircraft was the stuff of science fiction novels. Today, however, practical uses for drone aircraft are expanding rapidly, and Trinidad State is uniquely positioned to help lead the way.

In 2015, the Federal Aviation Administration awarded the San Luis Valley a *Certificate of Waiver or Authorization*, opening up its skies for Unmanned Aerial Vehicle (UAV) use. This designation allowed commercially licensed drone operators and researchers to fly unmanned aircraft up to 15,000 feet in altitude, above the previous 400 feet.
